

Interview Tip: Keep it Positive!

You will be asked many questions during your interview. Your responses should *always* be positive. Potential employers want to know why you are looking to make a move. However, sharing too much information too early in the relationship could backfire.

A single negative comment will stay with an interviewer long past all the positive statements you may make. "Why are you looking to make a move?" can be a tricky question. Saying anything negative about your current employer, manager, or product will leave the interviewer wondering if you would do the same or feel the same about working for them.

Turn a Negative in to a Positive!

Steer clear of negative comments and always turn a negative in to a positive. When asked for example: "What are your weaknesses?" say something like: "I have a low tolerance for disorganization". This response is actually a positive; you like to be organized.

When asked "Why are you looking to make a move?", focus on growth, furthering your skills, or better yet compliment the potential employer: "ABC Company is making a real impact in the marketplace and I would like to be a part of a winning team."
